Manassas City Candidates

Rick Bookwalter

Rick has lived in the City for 21 years and is the father of twelve children. Rick served in the Navy as a pilot and after service flew for the airlines. He is a small business owner. Rick's platform emphasizes fiscal responsibility, social conservatism and improving relations with Prince William County. He has been an active volunteer in the City.

DJ's platform is affordable housing, strengthening public services, and quality education.

Ralph Smith (incumbent)

Ralph is running for re-election and is a long time resident of the City. Ralph's platform is continuing the investment in crucial infrastructure as well as economic development making Manassas a strong attraction for new families to move to our City. Ralph is committed to ensuring the Police and Fire Departments are funded.

Sonia Vasquez Luna

Sonia moved to Manassas from El Salvador in 2010 and is the mother of two children in the Manassas school system. Sonia's platform stresses expanding our local transportation options, having a strong relationship with the School Board, inclusive City Government and growing our local economy..
